Requirements:

Rationale:

- To bring together a community of health professionals interested in personal finance.
- To promote financial literacy across campus and engage students in smart financial decision making.
- To encourage diverse conversations surrounding finance.
- To promote financial independence and well-being that allows health professionals the freedom to focus on their passions.

Objectives: The lecture-based portion of the elective will cover various topics within the realm of finance and medicine, ranging from wage negotiation, to the gender wage gap, to personal investing and finance. Additionally, the elective will offer additional engaging opportunities for students to learn more about personal finance.

Format:

One semester, 12 classes, 1 hour each. Classes will consist of instructor/guest presentations and will predominantly take place virtually via Microsoft Teams. Links to attend the meetings will be sent out a few days prior. A library of pre-recorded lectures will be available for additional self-directed enrichment.

In addition to lectures, students can self-report hours for participation. A maximum of 2 hours can be obtained through self-reported pre-recorded lecture watching.

Student Evaluation: Grades will be pass/fail. Attendance is required to receive credit for the course.

Course Evaluation:

Grading will be pass/fail. To receive transcript acknowledgment, students must:
