Course Description: This is a four-week elective course, covering the field of surgical pathology. Students will participate in gross dissection and frozen sections, visit cytology sign out sessions, and daily sign out sessions. Students will participate in didactic sessions and conferences and learn how the field of surgical pathology contributes to patient care.

Methods of Instruction:

A. Didactic

- Thursdays, 1PM (virtual log in). (Subspecialty specific consultant conferences have varied scheduled --> contact resident on service).
- AP lectures and/or unknown slide conference (7:00 AM and 8:00 AM most mornings, different locations – ask the pathology residents)
- PAPCARS Conference (once a month, 4th Friday, 1:00 PM, Childers Conference Room)
- Subspecialty specific Tumor Boards (Consult attending or resident on service)

B. Clinical

- Daily sign-out sessions with faculty, residents and/or fellows (time varies, ask the pathology residents on the rotation)
- Gross dissection and frozen sections with residents and Pathologists' Assistants (PAs)
- Visit a few cytology sign-out sessions (4th floor) - ask the senior residents.

Overview of student responsibilities

- Observe gross dissection of specimens in the gross room.
- Observe intra-operative consultations /frozen sections.
- Review slides and participate at sign-out sessions with residents and faculty.
- Collect clinical information from electronic medical databases (EPIC, Cerner, CoPath), as needed.
